The classroom work has been long, but rewarding and we are looking forward to the next chapter that God intends to write in our lives. We've have been blessed by the help we've received from our church family. A few weeks ago some middle school girls joined by their teachers completed more work in a little over an hour than my buddy and I did in half a day!



Something was said about women being better organized, whatever . . . On top of our household stuff, we've been packing donated books and many other things necessary to operate a school. We thank those schools in Marion County who will play a large part in educating the children - even in another country.



The number of man hours put into collecting, sorting, repacking, and transporting is overwhelming. We continue to ask you to pray for these efforts, to pray for God's provision and to consider what part you can play in supporting these efforts.



We truly believe that God chooses to use us to work His miracles. Not that He needs us, but He blesses us with these opportunities to exhibit the love of Jesus Christ in our lives as we reach out to share that same love with others Through us is how the unsaved come to know the love of Jesus Christ that is part of God's plan.
