The Guerrier Institute Opens for the 2012-2013 School Year

October 1st was the first day of school for students attending the Guerrier Institute. Both parents and students began arriving for the first day before the bell even began ringing to call them to school. The school serves over seventy students in Pre-K through 5th grade.



Standing in straight rows, wearing their uniforms, they stood at attention as the Haitian flag was raised and the anthem sung. Before hurrying off to their classes, they were welcomed to the new school year by Benis.



Each Friday, the students attend chapel services. There, they recite the pledge to the

Bible and the Christian flag in both English and French.

Hurricane Sandy

Hurricane Sandy decided to visit Mapou and stayed for a few days. The sudden onslaught of rain filled the cisterns to overflowing, so much so that the water began to flood down the mountain and had to be diverted with sandbags. A major effect of the flooding is that many families were forced out of their homes during the storm and took refuge at the church. IMoH set up a makeshift kitchen to feed all of the villagers affected by the storm. For several days, families were living in the classrooms

because they were not able to get back into their homes. Please pray for the clean-up/ repair. Benis is currently designing a new project to structurally improve the homes in Mapou so they will be able to hold up better in storms.

UPCOMING

A team from Canyon Bible Church in Prescott, Arizona, will be coming to Mapou to host a Leadership/Discipleship Seminar for the churches of the island. The seminar will be held December 6-8 and approximately 300 people are expected to attend.

Missionaries Benis and Dominique Guerrier and family are full-time missionaries living in Mapou Village on the island of La Gonave off of the western coast of Haiti. Their ministries to the people of the island include church-planting, education, feeding the hungry, medical/dental clinics, and leadership training.
