### March 17-24

The Saturday before Palm Sunday was spent cleaning and working on the church. A team from California joined us for a few days to participate in the services and take part in the Saturday preparation. In addition to this, several workers continued working on the underconstruction baptistry. When completed, churches from around the area will be able to use this for baptisms instead of having to trek down to the ocean.

On Palm Sunday morning, the church was so packed that villagers brought in their own chairs due to the lack of seating. Everyone was there, including many visitors from the several other churches who had walked for hours to attend.

The service was a mix of heartfelt prayer, joyous praise, and passionate preaching.
